DIETETIC INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2017



Department of State Hospitals (DSH) - Napa is a low to moderate-security psychiatric hospital. The hospital admits patients who have been referred from their home county under a civil commitment or through the courts on a forensic commitment. All patients admitted to DSH - Napa suffer from a major mental illness. Our Dietetic Internship Program is an eleven-month generalized program with a concentration on mental health nutrition.

The program's mission is to promote individual learning in nutrition and dietetics and advocate development of individuals who are equipped with unique skills, resources and abilities. It seeks to provide an educational environment that acknowledges each individual's learning potential and facilitates development of marketable skills. The program's goals and objectives are:

- 1) To prepare graduates to be competent entry-level dietitians.
 - a. 100% of interns will complete the program within 17 months.
 - b. Over a five year period, 80% of graduates who sought employment in dietetics will be employed or further educated in a dietetics-related field within the first year of program completion.
 - c. Over a five year period, 95% of graduates will take the RD exam within one year of program completion.
 - d. Over a five year period, graduates will achieve an 80% pass rate on the RD exam on the first attempt.
 - e. 90% of graduates will be given ratings of "meets standards" or better by their employers on the Post Internship Survey-Employer.
- 2) To provide quality training and experience in several California State institutions in an effort to encourage graduates to seek permanent employment with the State of California and the program affiliates.
 - a. 50% of graduates will pursue dietetic-related positions available in the California State Employment System or with one of the program's affiliates.
 - b. 25% of graduates will obtain a dietetic-related position within the California State Employment System or with one of the program's affiliates.

Program outcome data is available upon request.

Supervised practice experience is provided in food service administration, clinical dietetics, and community nutrition. Interns have the opportunity to participate in several unique learning experiences, including providing nutrition care for adults and children with mental illness. Program affiliations contribute to expanding the knowledge and professional practice necessary to becoming a competent dietitian. Clinical affiliations include the Center for Behavioral Health, Queen of the Valley

Medical Center, Sutter Solano Medical Center, North Bay Medical Center, Contra Costa Regional Medical Center, Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital, Sutter Santa Rosa Regional Hospital and Davita Dialysis Centers. Affiliations with Napa Solano Head Start, Solano County Health Department and OLE Health supplement the program's community nutrition curriculum.

The DSH - Napa Dietetic Internship Program is currently granted accreditation status by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, 120 South Riverside Plaza, Suite 2000, Chicago, IL 60606-6995, (312) 877-0400, extension 5400. Guided by its standards, the program is designed to provide didactic and supervised practice to meet eligibility requirements and to increase the intern's understanding of professional practice. Interns qualify to take the Registration Exam for Dietitians upon successful completion of the program.

CLASSES

Interns attend classes, which supplement supervised practice experience. Classes cover a variety of topics to update nutrition information and prepare for planned clinical experiences. The internship preceptors and guest speakers assist in expanding this portion of the experience.

FOOD SERVICE ADMINISTRATION

DSH - Napa provides services to approximately 1150 patients daily by using a cookchill production system. Interns gain hands-on experience with menu planning, largescale food production and service methods, purchasing, personnel, management, and cost control techniques.

CLINICAL NUTRITION

Experiences include nutritional assessment, development and implementation of nutrition care plans, and individual and group counseling/education. The intern interacts with other health care professionals and is an active member of the interdisciplinary health care team. Clinical practice involves patients in both long-term care and acute care medical settings. The intern gains experience in medical nutrition therapy and nutrition support. Clinical experience includes areas such as diabetes, cardiology, renal, critical care, geriatrics, oncology and GI disorders. Interns prepare and present an oral case study, and other projects are assigned to reinforce nutrition principles in the clinical setting.

STAFF EXPERIENCE

The intern will be given the opportunity to work independently and use the skills and knowledge gained during the clinical rotation.

COMMUNITY NUTRITION

Experience will relate the role of the dietitian in administering nutritional care in the community and as a resource person for respective agencies and programs.

EDUCATION/MARKETING BLOG

Interns develop a shared blog site on which they research topics of current interest in the field of nutrition and use social media to educate consumers.

ELECTIVES

Time is set aside at the end of the program year for interns to develop a rotation in individual area (s) of interest.

GENERAL INFORMATION/PROGRAM POLICIES

The internship program usually begins on August 1st and continues through June 30th.

Free housing is furnished on hospital grounds. Only interns are allowed to live in the on-site housing. No pets are allowed. All meals will be provided per site availability. A small educational stipend will be paid monthly.

Use of a private vehicle is required since transportation to off-site locations is the intern's responsibility. The affiliations are located within a sixty-mile radius of Napa and public transportation is not available. Carpooling cannot be depended on as a means of transportation since each intern's schedule is different.

Health insurance is highly recommended; however, it is not required nor provided. DSH-Napa employee's clinic and employee assistance program offer limited services and are available to the interns at no expense.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION

- The student must possess a Baccalaureate Degree from an accredited college or university and meet requirements of an Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics accredited didactic program in Dietetics within the past five years.
- An original verification statement or "declaration of intent to complete degree"
 must be provided by the didactic program director prior to admission to the
 program. If the date on the DPD Verification Statement is more than 5 years
 prior to the start date of the internship, the applicant must take or have taken 9
 credits in graduate level dietetics-related coursework within the last 5 years at
 a university with an approved DPD or coordinated program. At least one
 course in medical nutrition therapy is required.
- A G.P.A. of at least 3.0 in DPD professional and science courses is mandatory.
- Once selected, interns must pass a physical exam and background check prior to starting the program. A drug screen may be required for participation in some rotations. These services are provided by the hospital, free of charge, but will not be reimbursed to the intern if services are provided elsewhere.
- Once selected, interns must have vaccinations or blood titers for Mumps, Rubeola, Rubella, Varicella, Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (Tdap),

Hepatitis B, and Influenza (or declination), as well as a 2-step tuberculin skin test. These immunizations and titers are provided by the hospital, if needed, free of charge, but will not be reimbursed to the intern if services are provided elsewhere.

- Foreign students should contact the program for eligibility requirements.
- The program conducts phone interviews with its top candidates prior to the matching deadline.

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

In order to graduate from the program, the intern must successfully complete all planned supervised practice components and assignments within 17 months. This is measured by written performance appraisals which reflect at least the level of "meets standard" in all core competencies. When the intern successfully completes the Dietetic Internship Program, the Director will issue a signed Verification Statement and submit CDR eligibility for them to take the RD examination.

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APPLICATION INFORMATION

The program uses the on-line Dietetic Internship Centralized Application System (DICAS). DICAS can be contacted by email at DICASInfo@DICAS.org or at https://portal.dicas.org.

The program accepts applications for the spring match only. The on-line application must be completed no later than 11:59 p.m. Central Time on **February 15, 2017**. The fee to use DICAS is \$45 for the first application submitted and \$20 for each additional application.

The Department of State Hospitals - Napa Dietetic Internship Program requires the following information be provided by all applicants through the DICAS system:

Completed Dietetic Internship Program application. Your application will not be considered if your work and volunteer experiences are not included in the applicable section of the application. Applicants are encouraged to include all work and volunteer experiences, not just those that are nutrition-related.

Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.

Three professional letters of reference from individuals who know you well and can speak to your strengths and weaknesses.

Current resume or vitae.

Personal statement that addresses the questions outlined in the DICAS application.

Declaration of Intent to Complete Degree and Academy Minimum Academic Requirements or DPD Program Verification Statement.

Applicants must register and enter their Dietetic Internship priority choices online at www.dnddigital.com. There is a \$55 charge for computer matching that is due at the time the applicant registers. Address questions or inquiries to:
