

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

<u>From the I-10 West:</u> Take the I-10 East to 210 West; exit Highland Ave. turn Right on Highland, pass Victoria Avenue- Patton State Hospital (3102 E. Highland) is on left side of street.

<u>From 210 West:</u> Take 210 East towards Redlands, exit Highland Ave. turn Left on Highland, pass Arden and Victoria Avenues-Patton State Hospital (3102 E. Highland) is on the left side.

#### WHERE IS THE AUDITORIUM AND PARKING?

Enter the main entrance to the hospital (North) from Highland Avenue, turn left in front of the Administration building (second stop, at the flag pole); Auditorium is directly ahead on the right.
