SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 FINAL RECONCILED ANNUAL GROWTH CAP DATA RELEASE

RE: IST GROWTH CAP DEPARTMENT LETTER 23-003

On August 1, 2023, the Department of State Hospitals (DSH) released Department Letter (DL) 23-003 that provided updated information on statutory requirements included in Senate Bill (SB) 184 (Chapter 47, Statutes of 2022) that clarified the growth cap for all counties for individuals committed as Incompetent to Stand Trial (IST) on felony charges pursuant to Section 1370 of the Penal Code. Attached to DL 23-003 was a report identifying each county's updated baseline number and the annual unreconciled IST determination number.

In accordance with the requirements outlined in DL-23-003, please find attached to this letter the final reconciled data report for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23. No adjustments are anticipated for the final reconciled data report. However, if a county has information that may lead to a correction of the yearly IST referral count, a dispute may be filed with DSH. The dispute window for reconciled IST determination data attached will run from the date of issuance of this memo through January 31, 2024. For more information on how to file a dispute please refer to Department Letter 23-003, Attachment E, <u>Dispute Process</u>.

If your county has a designated representative on file, no further action is needed. DSH will automatically share the individual level data report to the respective county representatives for FY 2022-23. If your county has not elected a designated representative, please review Attachment D, on Submitting a <u>Designated Representative</u>.

For counties subject to a redirection of funds under the IST Growth Cap, the invoicing process, timeline, and distribution of funds from the MHD Fund is outlined in DL 23-003, which can be found on the DSH Webpage by using the link below:

### Methodology Notes:

FY 2022-23 Baseline determinations reflect FIST referrals received with a commitment date to a DSH funded program in FY 2022-23 and referrals were received no later than 8/31/2023. This methodology would be applied to IST Determinations for all subsequent years.

#### Adjustments to the FIST determination count include:

Program Revokes - these are FIST individuals who may have been committed to DSH and placed in a diversion or CBR program in a prior fiscal year then revoked from the program and subsequently re-referred to DSH (inpatient) on the same charge in the applicable fiscal year.

Cancelled FIST commitments/referrals to DSH include FIST individuals who were committed to DSH and either competency was restored or case was dismissed while waiting in jail prior to DSH treatment and/or re-evaluation. Cancelled FIST commitments are excluded as one of the adjustments reducing the FY 2022-23 baseline count. For FY 2022-23 and all future years, cancelled commitments will be incorporated as an adjustment and reduced from the IST determination counts.

Re-Evaluated 1372 includes individuals who were re-evaluated by DSH's Re-Evaluation Program and identified as competent prior to admission to any DSH treatment program, including Early Access and Stabilization Services (EASS). Totals also include the re-evaluations performed by Los Angeles County Office of Diversion and Re-Entry (known as "off-ramps").

EASS 1372 includes IST individuals who were found competent after participation in EASS services, but were removed from the DSH wait list prior to admission to a DSH program bed in a JBCT, State Hospital, Community Inpatient Facility, CBR, Diversion or CONREP.
